There are basic styles of political leadership: traditional, modern technical, bureaucratic, and charismatic. Traditional leaders base their claim to leadership on the assertion that they are the clear and logical successors to a line of leaders that stretches back in time and that is legitimized by practice. They are leaders because of historical forces, and they claim the right and obligation to continue. They often imply that their leadership is necessary to main social order on

the right course. Traditional political orders, while conservative, are not rigid or unyielding to change, but they may be slow to implement a schedule of changes or react to changing conditions. They expect change to occur over relatively extended periods of time.

As defined by Max Weber, a charismatic leader possesses particular characteristics that set him apart from normal leaders. A charismatic leader is, in a word unique. He possesses personal characteristics that are suited to a particularly intense leadership style; and he is capable of creating or participating in an intense, reciprocal psychological exchange with his followers, His actions and proposals are legitimized by reference to some awe-inspiring source, religious, historical, natural, or mystical. The charismatic leader will promulgate substantial and convincing images of a new order, perhaps ordained in heaven, that will raise the community to new levels of activity and accomplishment, or in another variant, restore the community to its rightful place in the world. Another characteristic of charismatic leaders is their resonant rhetorical gift-resonant in the sense that they can raise sympathetic responses from their followers.
